Clare Perry has worked with the Environmental Investigation Agency (EIA) since 1998. She currently leads EIA's climate campaign which aims to reduce tackle the threat of climate change by eliminating powerful greenhouse gases used widely in the cooling sector, improving energy efficiency of replacement technologies and improving enforcement of multilateral environmental agreements designed to curb the trade in these harmful chemicals.

She has attended meetings of the Montreal Protocol since 2007, was closely involved in the revision of the EU F-Gas Regulation, and advocates the use of climate-friendly alternatives to HFCs in multiple fora, in particular in the commercial refrigeration sector. Clare graduated from the University of Southampton in 1993 with a BSc in biology and subsequently gained a Masters degree in coastal zone management.
